## **2024** Community Service Outline Sun Lakes Holiday Service and Service Do's and Don'ts

### Holiday Schedule

WCofAZ observes four (4) Holidays throughout the year and will not be providing collection service on these Holidays:

If your service day falls on one of the listed holidays, shown to the right, then you will receive service the following day. The rest of the week following the holiday is also pushed back one day, with Friday's customers being serviced on Saturday. Holidays such as Memorial Day, Labor Day, MLK Day, Presidents Day and Veterans Day are not affected. Please set your carts out on regular day of service. Complete 2024 schedule:

Your Service day for curbside trash and recycling is: Sun Lakes (non-IronOaks) - Monday & Thursday Recycling is the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Wednesday of each month

IronOaks Tuesday & Friday Recycling is the 1st and 3rd Wednesday of each month

### Fun Fact - Advanced Technology

Trash and recycling collection can be tricky business. 3rd Eye® on-board camera systems constantly monitors WCofAZ drivers as well as their environment to ensure the safe operation of their vehicle. It also allows managers and customer service staff immediate verification of service through recorded video. Five placed cameras per truck provide a 360° coverage to monitor vehicle and driver environment in real time.






### Service Compliance Requirements for Curbside Trash and Recycling Collection

Place both garbage and recycling carts out the night prior, or by 6:00 a.m., on your service day. Contracted service is 6:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. Due to weather, equipment, road construction, changes in routing, etc... there are no guaranteed times on the day of

scheduled service. Position carts on the street with wheels as close to the curb as possible. Allow three (3) feet in all directions, from cars, mailboxes, fencing, landscape or other items that may interfere with service or at risk of damage. 10' from vehicles parked on the street (see diagram below) Face cart so lid opens toward the street (handles facing home of service). Do not overfill or place additional garbage on top. Lids must be fully closed. This reduces airborne trash on windy days. Always keep sidewalks clear for pedestrian traffic and children. Items such as oil, paint, solvents and other liquid household hazardous waste materials are strictly forbidden within your curbside program.



Ensure the cart lids open to ward the street

in the driveway or in landscape. If community has no gutter area please ensure a 3' margin from all landscape and fixed items as reflected above.



# **2024** Community Bulk Pick-up Schedule

#### Sun Lakes

To receive bulk service customers **MUST** schedule by calling Waste Connections of Arizona (*WCofAZ*) at **480.983.9100** no later than noon the Wednesday before service. Without scheduling WCofAZ will not service your bulk placement. To ensure bulk pick-up, customers will need to make sure all materials are set out properly and placed curbside prior to 6 a.m. on day of collection. Materials will be collected by 6 p.m. on the assigned day.

## 2024

To receive service you must call 480.983.9100 and schedule by 12:00 noon the day before scheduled service, to receive bulk pick-up.

The fee for non-free days is \$85.00.

### DO

DO – Cut tree branches and wood into 4 foot lengths and bundle/tie together with twine, duct tape, etc...

DO – Place loose yard waste such as leaves and grass in bags

DO – Place furniture, such as chairs and couches at curb. No special preparation required.

DO – Place century plants, cactus and other similar plants in boxes.

## DO NOT's

DO NOT: Place limbs or yard waste in a pile without being tied together

DO NOT: Place construction materials (concrete, dirt, rock, gravel, concrete blocks, drywall, etc...) at curb. Construction debris is solid waste derived from the construction, repair, remodeling of structures and will not be collected.

DO NOT: Place oil, paint, batteries or other hazardous materials

#### **Vacation Hold Policy**


Vacation Hold Service — also known as seasonal service, holiday hold and snowbird billing — lets you pause your services up to sixe (6) months. You must provide notice of any Vacation Hold request to Waste Connections of Arizona at least two (2) business days before the date of the next regularly scheduled collection service. After six (6) months your service and billing is automatically reinstated. Improper Bulk Set-Out

### The allowed area for bulk is 4-cubic yards.



What does 4-cubic yards look like? A space that encompasses four dishwashers

### Acceptable materials for bulk collection include:

- Furniture and large appliances (excluding refrigerators)
- Household garbage and cardboard (including items that don't easily fit into the trash cart; the lid should close completely)
- Yard debris (including items that don't easily fit into the trash cart; the lid should close completely for standard collection; see additional requirements for preparing yard debris below)

# When preparing yard debris for bulk collection, remember the three **B's**; Bagged, Bundled or Boxed!

- Grass, leaves and other small items should be bagged and ARE not to exceed 50 pounds per bag.
- Tree limbs and cuttings cannot be longer than 4 feet and must be bundled and tied with twine, string, duct tape or similar cord so one person can handle them. Logs and limbs 12 inches in diameter or less are acceptable.
- Century plants, all cacti and similar plants that are hazardous to our collection employees should be boxed to avoid injury.

#### Unacceptable materials for bulk collection include:

Tires, refrigerators, freezers, hazardous materials, motor oil, paint, batteries and construction materials such as harmful debris, concrete, carpet, pavers and brick.

# **Recycling Service Guidelines**

## **The Big 5** - Hang on to this information! If you don't see it below, it's not allowed in your recycling cart

### **#1 Aluminum**



Clean aluminum beverage cans, pie pans, serving trays, cat food cans and foil.

Absolutely no other aluminum items, such as lawn furniture, automotive parts or other related items.

## **#3 Plastic Bottles**



Clean Plastic bottles, jugs and containers with Plastic 1-7 stamped

Plastic coat hangers, clothes baskets, PVC piping, patio furniture, electronics and plastic bags are not a 1-7 container, so it doesn't belong in your cart. Containers must be empty at a minimum, and rinsed whenever possible. Place plastic tops back on containers prior to recycling

### #5 Tin



Steel tin cans, vegetable, fruit, soup, etc... If it's not a tin can, it doesn't go into your recycling cart.

Metal hangers, scrap metal, frying pans, automotive parts or anything else that doesn't resemble a can is not accepted.

## **#4 Cardboard**



Glass



Newspaper, printing paper, junk mail, shredded paper, magazines, paper sacks and phone books, wax-free shipping paper.

If it's not listed above, it's not allowed

Cardboard boxes, cereal, frozen food and detergent cartons.

That's it—no other fiber products If it's not listed above, it's not allowed. Wood, carpet and textiles are sometimes made from natural fiber but they aren't cardboard, or cartons, so they don't belong in your cart. Also remove any plastic, Styrofoam and other related packaging items and place within your trash cart. Last, flatten all boxes to avoid overfilled carts.

The current model for glass, and the distance it must travel for processing, is no longer a sustainable or eco-friendly option. WCofAZ is constantly looking at ways of minimizing its carbon footprint and emissions created by recycling/manufacturing. Due to the composition of glass (sand), introducing it to landfill is safe and environmentally sound.

## What does incorrect use of trash and bad recycling look like?



Open lids cause airborne trash through neighborhood well before service



Landscape material is not recyclable



Appliances and electronics are not permitted in recycling



Over packed cart and cart placement (too close to car), unable to service



If paint or oil is placed in either cart it will burst open during service
