We continue to move the needle on the Safety Plan. This was developed by the Safety Task Force and continues to be moved forward by committees and the Board. We have partnered with the AZ Rangers successfully and they are instrumental in supporting our Patrol Staff. We have redirected traffic to Grill on Green down Halley. Committees are currently reviewing our soon-to-be-implemented Traffic Calming Study and gate access control software. We are working on some exciting Reserve Projects including a refresh of the Clubhouse and painting of facility buildings. The Clubhouse project will include new floors, wall coverings, lighting, and furniture, and will be brought to committees and the board over the next couple of months. Painting the buildings will be brought to the Board in May for approval and then back to committees for color selection and execution this Fall. Some less exciting but equally important equipment will be replaced in accordance with the Reserve Spending Plan.

As we come into the summer months, it is a reminder that we are in a desert experiencing a drought. Although we get high marks for our water conservation efforts, we want to continue improving. Committees, Management, and the Board of Directors are looking to reduce our water usage on the golf course and the common areas. This gives us an opportunity to improve the aesthetics of our community with drought tolerant landscape while reducing our water usage. Conservation programs from SRP, Trees Matter, and others will be introduced to homeowners soon.

I count myself lucky to be a part of such a well-run organization. I have not worked with a more collaborative, professional, and dedicated community including committees, homeowners, staff, and the Board of Directors. I look forward to many more successful years here at IronOaks.

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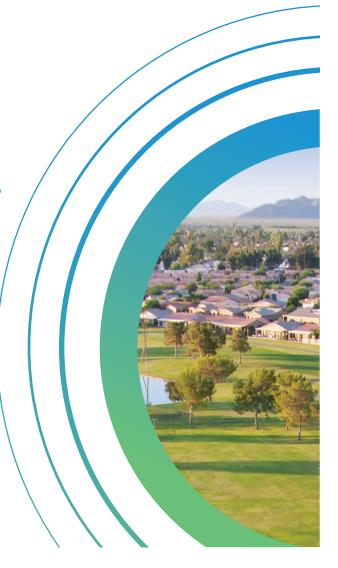
